## **President's Report**

Thank you to everyone who helped set up the rooms, put up the Art work for our Art display and to our tutors and members for representing the classes so well on Open Day.

We welcomed a large number of visitors to our rooms to see our classes in action, to take part in the Tai Chi demonstration, the Line Dancing and enjoy our very entertaining ukulele players and our singing group.

Toni from the Stroke Foundation gave a very interesting talk on Stroke prevention. She herself had a stroke at age 42 and she told us of the signs to look for if you suspect you are having a stroke:

FAST – Face, Arm, Speech, Time. Time being very important for getting help if you suspect someone is having a stroke.

Quite a few new people have enrolled in classes and paid their membership fees already. We received many compliments about how inviting our rooms look with all the art work and busy tutors showing what they do. Most visitors spent more than an hour in the rooms and in the conference room. Visitors regularly commented on how friendly and welcoming we are and we received many messages from members saying this was the best Open Day they had attended.

We have enrolled 76 new members this year and now exceed 200 members with a few still to be added to the system. Most of the members not added to the system yet have enrolled in the Tai Chi class. Our new Tai Chi tutor is David McClure. He is contracted until the end of November. If you want to see him return next year don't forget to make this known. We will conduct a survey at the end of November to assess interest for next year.
